Re: Freedom of Information Law Request

Dear Records Access Officer,

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Law (FOIL), N.Y. Pub. Off. Law §§ 84-90, American Oversight makes the following request for records.

The coronavirus pandemic has disproportionally killed people living in nursing homes. According to the *New York Times*, as of May 11, 2020, nursing home residents and staff have comprised one-third of all coronavirus deaths in the United States. New York State nursing homes alone have had 5,637 documented cases and 5,403 deaths, representing roughly 20% of the state's total deaths.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that your office produce the following records within five business days:

- 1. Records sufficient to identify any directive, order, decision, protocol, assessment, or guidance from your agency to care centers regarding the novel coronavirus, including but not limited to measures to prevent or mitigate the virus's spread.
- 2. All email communications (including email messages, complete email chains, email attachments, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments) <u>sent</u> by any of the officials listed below that include any of the key terms listed below.

In an effort to accommodate New York City Department of Health & Mental Hygiene and reduce the number of potentially responsive records to be processed and produced, American Oversight has limited its request to emails sent by the listed custodians. To be clear, however, American Oversight still requests that complete email chains be produced, displaying both sent and received messages. This means, for example, that both Deputy Commissioner Morgenthau's response to an email with the listed key terms and the initial received message are responsive to this request and should be produced.

Please provide all responsive records from March 1, 2020, through the date of the search

Fee Waiver Request

American Oversight requests that your agency consider waiving any fees associated with processing this request for records pursuant to 21 NYCRR § 1401.8(g). American Oversight is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit with the mission to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and Twitter.3 The public has a significant interest in how New York responded to coronavirus clusters in nursing homes. Records with the potential to shed light on this issue would contribute significantly to public understanding of operations of the New York City and New York State governments, including helping policy makers around the state and the rest of the country prevent coronavirus clusters within their nursing homes.

To the extent your agency anticipates charging any fees in connection with this request for records, American Oversight requests that you inform us in advance of doing so.

Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

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- Please search all locations and systems likely to have responsive records, regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics.
- In conducting your search, please understand the term "record" in its broadest sense, to include any written, typed, recorded, graphic, printed, or audio material of any kind. We seek records of any kind, including electronic records, audiotapes, videotapes, and photographs, as well as letters, emails, facsimiles, telephone messages, voice mail messages and transcripts, notes, or minutes of any meetings, telephone conversations or discussions.
- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted. To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to the email.
- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages.
- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.
