Re: Open Records Request

Dear Ms. Tulloch:

Pursuant to the Georgia Open Records Law (O.C.G.A. §§ 50-18-70 et seq.), American Oversight makes the following request for records.

## Requested Records

American Oversight requests that the Office of the Attorney General produce the following within three business days, or provide a written description of any responsive records with a timetable for their production within three business days:

All text message chains/conversations or message chains/conversations on messaging applications similar in form to text messages (such as Signal, WhatsApp, Facebook Messenger, Twitter DMs, etc.) sent to or received by Attorney General Christopher Carr, or anyone communicating on his behalf, such as an assistant or scheduler, containing any of the following search terms:

- a. "Black Lives Matter"
- b. BLM
- c. Police
- d. Sheriff
- e. Sheriffs
- f. Defund
- g. Defunding
- h. "Law enforcement"
- i. Disband
- i. Abolish
- k. Abolition
- l. Floyd
- m. Protest

- s. Protesting

Please provide all responsive records from June 1, 2020, through the date the search is conducted.

Please notify American Oversight of any anticipated fees or costs in excess of \$100 prior to incurring such costs or fees.

American Oversight requests the full message chain or conversation from the specified date range containing any of the listed key terms. For example, if Attorney General Carr had an ongoing text conversation from June 1, 2020, to June 5, 2020, including one message reflecting one of the key terms listed above, the entire text conversation for that 5-day period is responsive to American Oversight's request, and should be produced.

American Oversight insists that your office use the most up-to-date technologies to search for responsive information and take steps to ensure that the most complete repositories of information are searched. However, custodian searches are still required; your office may not have direct access to files stored on Attorney General Carr's cell phone, in .PST files, outside of network drives, in paper format, or in personal email accounts.

In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If it is your position that a document contains non-exempt segments, but that those non-exempt segments are so dispersed throughout the document as to make segregation impossible, please state what portion of the document is non-exempt, and how the material is dispersed throughout the document. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically that it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.

Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this

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request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

To ensure that this request is properly construed, that searches are conducted in an adequate but efficient manner, and that extraneous costs are not incurred, American Oversight welcomes an opportunity to discuss its request with you before you undertake your search or incur search or duplication costs. By working together at the outset, American Oversight and your office can decrease the likelihood of costly and time-consuming litigation in the future.

Where possible, please provide responsive material in electronic format by email or in PDF or TIF format on a USB drive. Please send any responsive material being sent by mail to American Oversight, 1030 15th Street NW, Suite B255, Washington, DC 20005. If it will accelerate release of responsive records to American Oversight, please also provide responsive material on a rolling basis.

## Conclusion

American Oversight is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit with the mission to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media.
