Re: Public Records Request

Dear Public Records Officer:

Pursuant to Article I, section 24(a), of the Florida Constitution, and Florida's public records laws, as codified at Fla. Stat. Chapter 119, American Oversight makes the following request for records.

On January 6, 2020, rioters stormed the U.S. Capitol, inciting violence that resulted in five deaths. County Commissioner Joe Mullins traveled to D.C. for the rally and attended the event.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that Flagler County Commission promptly produce the following:

 All email communications (including email messages, complete email chains, email attachments, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments) <u>sent</u> by Commissioner Joe Mullins containing any of the key terms below.

Please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2021, through January 15, 2021.

iii. Constitution

ii. Lutz

iv. "Gift cards"

In an effort to accommodate your office and reduce the number of potentially responsive records to be processed and produced, American Oversight has limited Item 1 of its request to communications <u>sent</u> by Commissioner Mullins. To be clear, however, American Oversight still requests that complete email chains be produced, displaying both sent and received messages. This means, for example, both Commissioner Mullins's response to an email containing one of the listed key terms and the initial received message are responsive to this request and should be produced.

2) All text messages or messages on messaging applications similar in form to text messages (such as Signal, WhatsApp, Facebook Messenger, Twitter DMs, etc.) sent or received Commissioner Joe Mullins containing any of the key terms listed in Part 1, above.

Please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2021, through January 15, 2021.

American Oversight requests complete text threads/conversations. This means, for example, if Commissioner Joe Mullins sent or received a text message containing any of the key terms listed above, the complete text thread/conversation for the timeframe listed above should be produced, and not just the message containing the key term.

3) Records reflecting any expenditures made and/or reimbursed by the county or local government in connection with Commissioner Joe Mullins's trip on or about January 6, 2021, to Washington, D.C., including, but not limited to, records of any reimbursements submitted by or on behalf of Commissioner Joe Mullins.

Responsive records would include, but are not limited to, hotel or other lodging invoices or receipts; government-issued charge card or travel

card reports; receipts from airlines, rental car, or other transportation companies; records reflecting the cost of government transportation; receipts or other records reflecting the cost of meals or refreshments; or records reflecting per diem payments.

Please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2021, through January 15, 2021.

Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

Please notify American Oversight of any anticipated fees or costs in excess of \$100 prior to incurring such costs or fee.

American Oversight seeks all responsive records regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics. American Oversight insists that your agency use the most upto-date technologies to search for responsive information and take steps to ensure that the most complete repositories of information are searched. American Oversight is available to work with you to craft appropriate search terms. However, custodian searches are still required; your office may not have direct access to files stored in .PST files, outside of network drives, in paper format, or in personal email accounts.

In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If it is your position that a document contains non-exempt segments, but that those non-exempt segments are so dispersed throughout the document as to make segregation impossible, please state what portion of the document is non-exempt, and how the material is dispersed throughout the document. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically that it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.

Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by your office before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

To ensure that this request is properly construed, that searches are conducted in an adequate but efficient manner, and that extraneous costs are not incurred, American Oversight welcomes an opportunity to discuss its request with you before you undertake your search or incur search or duplication costs. By working together at the outset, American Oversight and your agency can decrease the likelihood of costly and time-consuming litigation in the future.

Where possible, please provide responsive material in electronic format by email or in PDF or TIF format on a USB drive. Please send any responsive material being sent by mail to American Oversight, 1030 15th Street NW, Suite B255, Washington, DC

20005. If it will accelerate release of responsive records to American Oversight, please also provide responsive material on a rolling basis.

Conclusion
