Re: Government Records and Access Management Act Request

Dear Records Custodian:

Pursuant to the Utah Government Records Access and Management Act (GRAMA), Utah Code §§ 63G-2-101 et seq., American Oversight makes the following request for records.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that your office produce the following records within ten business days:

1. Records reflecting the expenses and costs incurred by the Utah House of Representatives related to Representative Steve Christiansen's trip to Phoenix, Arizona on or around June 9, 2021.1

To the extent your office has aggregated records sufficient to show all relevant expenses and costs, such as in spreadsheets, American Oversight would accept production of such records as sufficient. To the extent your office does not have an aggregated record of these costs, American Oversight requests records reflecting those costs, such as receipts, invoices, charge card or credit card statements, and reimbursement requests.

Relevant expenses may include, but are not limited to, hotel or other lodging costs; costs for air travel, rental car, or other transportation companies; costs incurred for government transportation; the cost of meals or refreshments; and diem payments.

Relevant expenses include costs associated with the travel of Representative Christiansen, and of any staff members, family members, or other individuals travelling with him.

2. All email communications (including emails, email attachments, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments) sent by Representative Christiansen or anyone communicating on his behalf such as a Chief of Staff, scheduler, or assistant, regarding Representative Christiansen's trip to the Phoenix, Arizona, on or about June 9, 2021, or about the Maricopa County election audit.²

In an effort to accommodate the House of Representatives and reduce the number of potentially responsive records to be processed and produced, American Oversight has limited its request to emails <u>sent</u> by Representative Christiansen and his staff. To be clear, however, American Oversight still requests that complete email chains be produced, displaying both sent and received messages. This means, for example, that both Christiansen's response to an email about the trip and the initial received message are responsive to this request and should be produced.

- 3. Any handouts, agendas, summaries, or notes created by or provided to Representative Christiansen as part of his trip to Phoenix, Arizona, on or about June 9, 2021.
- 4. All email communications (including emails, email attachments, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments) between (a) Representative Christiansen or anyone communicating on his behalf such as a Chief of Staff, scheduler, or assistant and (b) Christiana Bobb, or anyone communicating on behalf of One American News Network (OANN), including from an email address ending in @oann.com.

Please note that American Oversight does not seek, and that this request specifically <u>excludes</u>, the <u>initial</u> mailing of news clips or other mass-distribution emails. However, subsequent communications responding to or forwarding such emails <u>are</u> responsive to this request. In other words, for example, if Representative Christiansen received a mass-distribution news clip email from OANN, that initial email would <u>not</u> be responsive to this request. However, if Representative Christiansen forwarded that email to another individual with his own commentary, that subsequent message would be responsive to this request and should be produced.

Please provide all responsive records from June 1, 2021, through June 14, 2021.

Fee Waiver Request

In accordance with Utah Code § 63G-2-203(4)(a), American Oversight requests a waiver of fees associated with processing this request for records. Disclosure of the requested information will primarily benefit the public rather than a person, because the requested records will likely contribute to a better understanding of relevant government procedures by the general public in a significant way. Moreover, the request is primarily and fundamentally for non-commercial purposes.

American Oversight requests a waiver of fees because disclosure of the requested information primarily benefits the public rather than a person.³ The public has a significant interest in Representative Christiansen's trip to Phoenix, Arizona, to tour the audit of the 2020 election results in Maricopa County. Records with the potential to shed light on this matter would contribute significantly to public understanding of operations of the government, including the potential cost to taxpayers of this trip. American Oversight is committed to transparency and makes the responses agencies provide to public records requests publicly available, and the public's understanding of the government's activities would be enhanced through American Oversight's analysis and publication of these records.

Furthermore, this request is not for American Oversight's personal or financial interest. As described above, this request is primarily and fundamentally made for the purpose of educating the public and is not made for any commercial purposes. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, American Oversight does not have a commercial purpose and the release of the information requested is not in American Oversight's financial interest. American Oversight's mission is to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and Twitter.⁴

American Oversight has also demonstrated its commitment to the public disclosure of documents and creation of editorial content through regular substantive analyses posted to its website.⁵ Examples reflecting this commitment to the public disclosure of documents and the creation of editorial content include the posting of records and analysis related to the organization's investigations into misconduct and corruption in

state governments;⁶ posting records and analysis of federal and state governments' responses to the Coronavirus pandemic;⁷ posting records received as part of American Oversight's "Audit the Wall" project to gather and analyze information related to the Trump administration's proposed construction of a barrier along the U.S.-Mexico border, and analyses of what those records reveal;⁸ and the posting of records related to an ethics waiver received by a senior Department of Justice attorney and an analysis of what those records demonstrated regarding the Department's process for issuing such waivers.⁹

Accordingly, American Oversight qualifies for a fee waiver.

- Please search all locations and systems likely to have responsive records, regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics.
- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other
 materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted.
 To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all
 prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to
 the email.
- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages.
- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

Conclusion

If you have any questions regarding how to construe this request for records or believe that further discussions regarding search and processing would facilitate a more efficient production of records of interest to American Oversight, please do not hesitate to contact American Oversight to discuss this request.
