Re: Public Records Act Request

Dear Public Records Officer:

Pursuant to the Ohio Public Records Act (PRA), Ohio Rev. Code § 149.43, and other applicable Ohio law, American Oversight makes the following request for records.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that the Attorney General's Office promptly produce the following records:

1. All email communications (including emails, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and attachments thereto) between (a) any of the Ohio Attorney General's Office officials listed in Column A, below, and (b) any employees or representatives of the external organizations listed in Column B, below (including, but not limited to, anyone communicating from an email address ending in the listed domains) regarding firearms, including, but not limited to, any proposed or implemented firearm restrictions or allowances.

In an effort to accommodate your office and reduce the number of potentially responsive records to be processed and produced, American Oversight has limited item 1 of its request to email communications between Attorney General Office officials and the external parties specified above, as opposed to all email communications (or all correspondence) in the possession of your office regarding the subject matter specified above. If your office does not have the capability to craft a search for records that encompasses only these individuals as the correspondents, American Oversight would accept a broader search for email or other correspondence responsive to the above subject matter, but we would note that your office may narrow the results to email correspondence sent by the above individuals.

Please note that American Oversight does not seek, and that this request specifically <u>excludes</u>, the <u>initial</u> mailing of news clips or other mass-distribution emails. However, subsequent communications forwarding such emails <u>are</u> responsive to this request. In other words, for example, if Attorney General Yost received a mass-distribution news clip email from an email ending in @nra.org, that initial email would <u>not</u> be responsive to this request. However, if Attorney General Yost forwarded that email to another individual with his own commentary, that subsequent message would be responsive to this request and should be produced.

2. All email communications (including emails, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and attachments thereto) <u>sent</u> by any of the Ohio Attorney General's Office officials listed in Column A, above, containing any of the search terms listed below.¹

In an effort to accommodate your office and reduce the number of potentially responsive records to be processed and produced, American Oversight has limited item 2 of its request to emails <u>sent</u> by the listed custodians. To be clear, however, American Oversight still requests that complete email chains be produced, displaying both sent and received messages. This means, for example, that both Attorney General Yost's response to an email containing the term "Bump Stock" and that initial received message are responsive to this request and should be produced.

For both parts of this request, please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2021, through the date the search is conducted.

For both parts of this request, we believe your office is best suited to know the locations to be searched for responsive records. However, we believe Office-Wide Executive Correspondence and General Correspondence records series, at a minimum, are likely to have responsive email correspondence.

Please notify American Oversight of any anticipated fees or costs in excess of \$100 prior to incurring such costs or fee.

Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted.
 To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to the email.
- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages.

- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records.² If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

If you have any questions regarding how to construe this request for records or believe that further discussions regarding search and processing would facilitate a more efficient production of records of interest to American Oversight, please do not hesitate to contact American Oversight to discuss this request. American Oversight welcomes an opportunity to discuss its request with you before you undertake your search or incur search or duplication costs. By working together at the outset, American Oversight and your agency can decrease the likelihood of costly and time-consuming litigation in the future.

Where possible, please provide responsive material in an electronic format by email. Alternatively, please provide responsive material in native format or in PDF format on a USB drive. Please send any responsive material being sent by mail to American Oversight, 1030 15th Street NW, Suite B255, Washington, DC 20005. If it will accelerate release of responsive records to American Oversight, please also provide responsive material on a rolling basis.

Conclusion
