Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear FOIA Officer:

Pursuant to the Connecticut Freedom of Information Act, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 1-200 et seq., American Oversight makes the following request for records.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that your office produce the following records within four business days:

All email communications (including emails, complete email chains, email attachments, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments), text messages (including complete text message threads or conversations), and messages on messaging platforms (such as Slack, GChat, Google Hangouts, Lync, Skype, or WhatsApp) between (a) State Senator Robert Sampson or his aide Nolan Davis and (b) any of the external individuals or entities listed below (including, but not limited to, at the listed email addresses or domains):

Please provide all responsive records from January 11, 2021, through the date the search is conducted.

Fee Waiver Request

In accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 1-212(d)(3), American Oversight requests a waiver of fees associated with processing this request for records. Disclosure of the requested records will benefit the general welfare because it will likely contribute to a better understanding of relevant government procedures by the general public in a



significant way. In addition, the request is primarily and fundamentally for non-commercial purposes.

American Oversight requests a waiver of fees because disclosure of the requested information will "benefit the general welfare." The public has a significant interest in the actions of Senator Sampson regarding the 2020 presidential election. Records with the potential to shed light on this matter would contribute significantly to public understanding of operations of the government, including whether and to what extent Senator Sampson was involved in an open letter requesting a nationwide audit of the 2020 presidential election, and whether he communicated with other signatories or legislators involved in other matters concerning the election. American Oversight is committed to transparency and makes the responses agencies provide to FOIA requests publicly available, and the public's understanding of the government's activities would be enhanced through American Oversight's analysis and publication of these records.

Furthermore, this request is intended to benefit the general public welfare and is not made for commercial purposes. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, American Oversight does not have a commercial purpose and the release of the information requested is not in American Oversight's financial interest. Rather, American Oversight benefits the general welfare through its mission to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and Twitter.³

American Oversight has also demonstrated its commitment to informing and educating the public through public disclosure of documents and creation of editorial content through regular substantive analyses posted to its website.⁴ Examples reflecting this commitment to the public disclosure of documents and the creation of editorial content include the posting of records and analysis related to the organization's investigations into misconduct and corruption in state governments;⁵ posting records and analysis of

federal and state governments' responses to the Coronavirus pandemic;⁶ posting records received as part of American Oversight's "Audit the Wall" project to gather and analyze information related to the Trump administration's proposed construction of a barrier along the U.S.-Mexico border, and analyses of what those records reveal;⁷ and the posting of records related to an ethics waiver received by a senior Department of Justice attorney and an analysis of what those records demonstrated regarding the Department's process for issuing such waivers.⁸

Accordingly, American Oversight qualifies for a fee waiver.

Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

- Please search all locations and systems likely to have responsive records, regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics.
- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other
 materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted.
 To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all

prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to the email.

- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages.
- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

Conclusion

If you have any questions regarding how to construe this request for records or believe that further discussions regarding search and processing would facilitate a more efficient production of records of interest to American Oversight, please do not hesitate to contact American Oversight to discuss this request.
